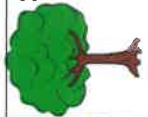

Description

| Species | Mature Height | Mature Spread | Growth Rate <u>S</u> – Slow <u>M</u> – Moderate <u>R</u> – Rapid | Light <u>S</u> – Shade <u>P</u> – Partial <u>F</u> – Full | Description |
|-----------------------|---------------|---------------|---|--|---|
| American Arborvitae | 60 | 15 | M | P-F | Soft, green needles with spreading flat sprays. Provides wildlife with shelter and food. |
| Colorado Blue Spruce | 60 | 20 | S | P-F | A conical-shaped evergreen tree with short stiff needles. Often used in residential landscapes. |
| Common Bald Cypress | 70 | 30 | M | P-F | Soft, feathery needles turn russet-red in Autumn. Loses its needles in winter and grows new set in Spring. |
| Douglas Fir | 81 | 20 | S-M | P-F | Can be planted as a windbreak or single species, not a true fir, it is a beautiful evergreen with a conical shape. |
| Norway Spruce | 60 | 30 | M-R | P-F | A large, pyramidal tree with long, cylindrical cones that hang on the dark green weeping branches. Adaptable and good for windbreaks. |
| Ponderosa Pine | 100 | 30 | M | F | It is a mainstay in the lumber industry but also used in windbreaks, buffer strips, reclamation and mass landscape planting. Its fast growth and interesting features make for a popular specimen or ornamental tree. |
| White Pine | 80 | 40 | M-R | P-F | Fine feathery needles, open canopy and straight trunk becomes more picturesque with time. Popular urban evergreen used for windbreaks and Christmas trees. |
| American Mountain Ash | 30 | 15 | S | P-F | A small tree with showy spring flowers, vibrant clusters of berries that attract many different types of birds along with amazing fall color making it a great landscape choice. |
| Hop Tree | 25 | 10 | M | S-P-F | A small native tree or large shrub that produces small clusters of fragrant flowers and water-like winged seeds, good plant for naturalizing or woodland landscapes. Is unaffected by the emerald ash borer. |
| Musclewood | 30 | 30 | S | S-P-F | Can be planted in shady landscapes. New leaves emerge reddish-purple, changing to dark green, then turn yellow to orange-red in the fall, offers a kaleidoscope of color throughout the year. |
| Wahoo Tree | 25 | | M | P-F | A native small tree or large shrub. It is colony-forming plant with small purple, hanging flowers in spring and beautiful fall color and 4-capsuled fruit in fall. |
| Black Walnut | 75 | 50 | M | F | Native tree that provides excellent shade, home to wildlife and food for humans and animals. |

| Bur Oak | 80 | 80 | S-M | F | Native tree that is a great choice as a shade tree. Its massive trunk has gray to brown furrowed bark and its branches bear lustrous dark green leaves that turn yellow-brown in fall. Large acorns with fringed caps attract birds and small mammals. |
| Northern Pecan | 100 | 75 | M | F | Large, straight-trunked nut tree native to river bottoms and rich fertile soils. The delicious nut ripens in the fall. |
| Red Oak | 75 | 75 | M | P-F | Native, faster growing oaks for the home landscape. The leaves display multiple colors starting with a pinkish red to dark green and turning bright red in autumn. Tolerant of salt and air pollution. |
| Sugar Maple | 45 | 35 | M | S-P-F | Dark green leaves turn an orange-red in the fall. Once established, it is tolerant of heat and drought. |
| Swamp Chestnut Oak | 100 | 60 | M | P-F | Provides dense shade and good red fall color. |
| American Hazelnut | 18 | 12 | M-R | P-F | A native shrub with tasty nuts are highly prized for their easy to crack shells and small, sweet kernel. Can be used as windbreaks, visual screens and to attract wildlife. |
