MERCER SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT MILKWEED POD COLLECTION

MILKWEED IS THE ONLY HOST PLANT FOR THE MONARCH BUTTERFLY FOR EGG LAYING AND CATERPILLAR REARING. IT ALSO SERVES AS A FOOD SOURCE FOR MONARCHS AS WELL AS MANY OTHER POLLINATOR SPECIES. THE DISAPPEARANCE OF MILKWEED ACROSS THE UNITED STATES HAS CONTRIBUTED TO THE 80% DECLINE OF THE EASTERN MONARCH BUTTERFLY POPULATION OVER THE LAST 20 YEARS.

- Collect the pods when they are dry, grey, or brown.
- It is best to store the pods in a paper bag so they don't collect moisture.
- If the center seam pops with gentle pressure, they are ready to harvest.
