COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE	60	20	S	P-F	A CONICAL-SHAPED EVERGREEN TREE WITH SHORT STIFF NEEDLES. OFTEN USED IN RESIDENTIAL LANDSCAPES. NEEDLES ARE OFTEN BLUE GREEN IN COLOR.
NORWAY SPRUCE	60	30	M-R	P-F	A LARGE, PYRAMIDAL TREE WITH LONG, CYLINDRICAL CONES THAT HANG ON THE DARK GREEN WEEPING BRANCHES. ADAPTABLE AND GOOD FOR WINDBREAKS.
WHITE SPRUCE	60	20	S	P-F	A LARGE, PYRAMIDAL EVERGREEN WITH AROMATIC FOLIAGE AND UNIFORM HABITAT. NEEDLES ARE PALE GREEN IN COLOR THROUGHOUT THE SUMMER AND TURN BROWN IN THE AUTUMN AND WINTER.
WHITE CEDAR (ARBORVITAE)	60	15	S-M	F	PYRAMIDAL TREE WITH SOFT, GREEN NEEDLES AND SPREADING FLAT SPRAYS. PROVIDES WILDLIFE WITH SHELTER AND FOOD.
RED SPRUCE	80	24	S-M	F	A NARROW CONICAL CROWN TREE WITH CURVED, SHARP POINTED NEEDLES YELLOW-GREEN IN COLOR.
JACK PINE	50	20	S	F	HARDY AND WELL SUITED FOR NORTHERN CLIMATES. USED IN WINDBREAKS AND EASILY TRANSFERABLE.
RED PINE	80	30	М	P-F	A LONG-LIVED EVERGREEN TREE OF DRY HABITATS. HAS A HIGH TOLERANCE FOR EXTREME COLD.
CHESTNUT OAK	70	70	S-M	P-F	BARK HAS THICK TRIANGULAR RIDGES AND DEEP FURROWS. FALL COLOR VARIES BETWEEN RED-ORANGE TO YELLOW-BROWN.

SCARLET OAK	75	75	M	F	DARK GREEN LEAVES DURING THE SUMMER CHANGING TO SCARLET IN THE FALL. BEST USED IN RESIDENTIAL YARDS.
RED MAPLE	60	40	M-R	P-F	LARGE TREE WITH COMPACT CROWN. BOASTS BRILLIANT DEEP RED AND YELLOW FALL COLORS WITH RED STEMS IN WINTER.
WHITE OAK	80	100	S-M	F	HAS WIDE-SPREADING HORIZONTAL BRANCHES AND WINE-RED FALL COLOR. THIS NATIVE TREE PROVIDES SHADE FOR LARGER LANDSCAPES AND PARKS
WHITE FLOWERING DOGWOOD	40	20	S	P-F	HAS WHITE FLOWERS IN THE EARLY SPRING, DARK GREEN LEAVES THROUGH SUMMER AND TURNS A BRILLIANT REDDISH PURPLE IN THE FALL.
JAPANESE TREE LILAC	30	25	M	F	PRODUCES LARGE CLUSTERS OF SMALL WHITE, FRAGRANT FLOWERS ATTRACTS BUTTERFLIES AND HUMMINGBIRDS.
BLACK CHOKEBERRY	8	8	S	P-F	WHITE FLOWERS ARE FOLLOWED BY BLACK FRUITS IN AUTUMN AND WINTER, SERVES AS A FOOD SOURCE FOR WILDLIFE.
BUTTERFLY BUSH	8	8	R	F	A LONG-BLOOMING SHRUB OR WOODY PERENNIAL WITH DENSE CLUSTERS OF FRAGRANT FLOWERS, ATTRACTS BUTTERFLIES AND HUMMINGBIRDS
SWEET SHRUB	9	12	S-M	P	HAS SWEET FRUITY SCENTED FLOWERS THAT OPEN IN APRIL-MAY. BEST USED IN LANDSCAPES.
